| PBP is 120 years old.

Jean-Pierre PENDU became project leader in 2007, assisted by Pierre THÉOBALD and Jean-Gualbert FABUREL SINCE 1999, THE NUMBER OF PARTICIPANTS EXPLODED. 3573 RIDERS REGISTERED IN 1999, 4184 IN 2003 AND 5311 IN 2007. THE EVENT BECAME MORE AND MORE INTERNATIONAL. IN 2007, MORE THAN 40 COUNTRIES FROM THE FIVE CONTINENTS WERE REPRESENTED, MAKING PARIS-BREST-PARIS RANDONNEUR THE BIGGEST INTERNATIONAL RANDONNEURING EVENT.

For the first time, Paris-Brest-Paris is held at the Agglomeration de Saint-Quentin-en-Yvelines.

## REGISTRATION

The registration period begins **on June 4 and ends on July 17, 2011**. Registrations can only be made through the PBP Web site.

You can register before having completed the qualifying brevets, but you need to provide the missing brevet certification numbers before July 17 or your registration will be cancelled.

# A SHORT EXTRACT FROM THE RULES

The Paris-Brest-Paris Randonneur is open to FFCT, UFOLEP and FSGT members, as well as to all international riders covered by insurance. The minimum age is 18 years at the date of the start.

- → Triathlon handlebars and all forms of bar extenders are forbidden.
- → Support vehicles are forbidden on the designated route for the riders, except around the area of the control points.

### At registration, you will have to select one of three start times :

Sunday, August 21– From 5:00 PM 80 hour time limit Sunday, August 21– From 6:30 PM 90 hour time limit Monday, August 22 - From 5:00 AM 84 hour time limit

#### About safety:

- → Bicycles must be equipped with front and rear lights attached firmly to the bike. Lights must be in working order and in non-flashing mode.
- → According to French law, a reflective vest is mandatory when riding at night. Alternatives like a reflective sash or belt are not acceptable as substitutes. Reflective ankle bands are recommended as an additional safety feature.
- → It is recommended to wear a helmet.
- → Bicycles must be equipped with front and rear brakes.

### PBP 2011 SCHEDULE

This schedule is preliminary and subject to changes.

### April 3, 2011: Opening of Preregistration

Preregistration will be open to riders who completed at least one BRM in 2010.

Preregistered riders still need to register definitely by June 19, 2011 or their preregistration will be cancelled.

#### June 4 - July 17, 2011 : Registration


Only online registrations will be accepted.

#### August 20 - 21, 2011 : Check-In

During this period, riders will go through the bike check at the Gymnase des Droits de l'Homme in GUYANCOURT and receive their brevet booklet, control badge, frame badge and other documents.

### August 21 - 25, 2011 : 17th PBP Randonneur

Start and finish is at the Gymnase des Droits de l'Homme in GUYANCOURT, which is part of the Communauté d'Agglomération de SAINT-QUENTIN-en-YVELINES.



# THE INTERNATIONAL NATURE OF PARIS-BREST-PARIS

The procedure at the control points will remain fundamentally the same as in the last five editions of PBP, i.e.

→ Volunteers will stamp the brevet cards.

→ The times of passage will be recorded by scanning the control badges.

→ Every ten minutes, the times of passage will be transmitted to our Web site.



The location of the control points remains the same as in 2007:

Villaines-la-Juhel	km 220 and km 988
Fougères	km 306 and km 902
Tinténiac	km 360 and km 848


Experience has shown that we can have confidence in the expertise and dedication of the staff at each control. More than 1500 volunteers overall will welcome you with all the friendly attention and understanding you will want for your physical and moral support.

Moreover, in 2011, we will offer an additional sleeping facility between Loudéac and Carhaix and a drop bag service to some controls to be designated.

In 2007, 3015 of the 5311 registrations came from abroad, representing 45 nations.

In 2011 again, the five continents will be represented. Given the worldwide growth in the sport of randonneuring, we expect to see in 2011 an even bigger diversity of nations than in the past. The Paris-Brest-Paris Randonneur proves to be the most international cycling event in the world.



# LIMITATION OF NUMBER OF ENTRANTS

We might be led to restrict the number of registrations in order to ensure the safety and quality of this event. Countries with a substantial number of participants will have a quota assigned, based on that country's results in PBP 2007 and the evolution of the number of homologated brevets in that country between 2007 and 2010. The other countries will share a pool of available registrations. The maximum total number of participants and the quota per country will be communicated early in 2011.

### PREREGISTRATION

From April 3, 2011, a preregistration scheme will enable you to know day after day how the ride fills up. To assure your best chances of participating, we recommend riding ACP-sanctioned brevets (i.e. BRM = Brevets de Randonneurs Mondiaux) in 2010. Brevets completed between November 2009 and October 2010 cannot be used to qualify for PBP, but give you the advantage of early preregistration as follows:

BRM 600 km	$\rightarrow$	April 17, 2011
BRM 400 km	$\rightarrow$	May 1, 2011
BRM 300 km	$\rightarrow$	May 15, 2011
BRM 200 km	$\rightarrow$	May 29, 2011

If the number of preregistrations exceeds the global rider limit, we will establish a waiting list.

You still need to start the definitive registration process before June 19, 2011 or the benefit of your preregistration will be lost. A 1200 km event sanctioned by the Randonneurs Mondiaux between November 2009 and October 2010 can replace a BRM 1000 km.



## QUALIFYING BREVETS

To qualify for PBP you must complete a Super Randonneur brevet series (200, 300, 400, and 600 km) of ACP-sanctioned brevets in 2011. Those brevets are offered in over 35 countries around the world.

For example, we are suggesting the following schedule to regional brevet administrators in France:

BRM 300 km	$\rightarrow$	from April 9 to May 22
BRM 400 km	$\rightarrow$	from April 23 to June 4
BRM 600 km	$\rightarrow$	from May 14 to June 26

In this, you will be supported by thousands of spectators – or rather fans – who will cheer from the roadside. As always, the future of this event depends on your behavior on the road. Permits are difficult to obtain; consequently, we urge you to obey all traffic laws and to always keep your safety and the safety of others in mind. We also ask you to respect the environment: please, don't discard empty containers or wrapping paper along the roads!

In 2011, we will celebrate twenty years of partnership with the Ville de GUYANCOURT and the Communauté d'Agglomération de SAINT-QUENTIN-en-YVELINES. This community has demonstrated its commitment to support bicycling across the board, from racing to touring, including BMX and mountain biking. We thank them for the trust they placed in us by letting us benefit from their facilities and their competencies such that we can make this 17th Paris-Brest-Paris Randonneur into a great celebration of bicycling.

HISTORY

1891

In 1891, Charles TERRONT entered the legend of Paris-Brest-Paris by winning the first edition ahead of 100 other entrants.


The 2<sup>nd</sup> edition, ten years later, included foreign participants and specified two categories of riders:

- Coureurs de vitesse (racers)
   Touristes-routiers (amateurs:
- Touristes-routiers (amateurs: the predecessors of randonneurs).

In 1931, two organizations were formed:


- one for the RANDONNEURS who promoted free-paced brevets.
- one for the AUDAX who preferred to ride in groups, with the pace being set by road captains. Therefore, the first Paris-Brest-Paris Randonneur goes back to 1931.


  44 randonneurs completed this first free-paced brevet of 1200 km in less than the time limit of 96 hours.

PBP in 2007 attracted over 100 recumbents, about 65 tandems, one triplet, many tricycles, single speeds, fixed-gear bicycles and even a 1920's French Hirondelle retro-direct.
