Kat Leyh (#15954) shares, "Nocturne is a non-fiction podcast that covers practically anything, with the only theme being "night". So the first episode that features randonneuring starts with a description of riding your bike through the night. The host, Vanessa Lowe, goes on to describe the sport, and speaks with a few seasoned randos about Paris-Brest-Paris and what it's like to ride incredible distances, sometimes through the night.

This was the first I had ever heard of randonneuring and I was instantly intrigued. My kind of cycling had started from a purely practical place - I needed to get around the city and run errands. At the time I listened to those episodes, I'd also been getting into long distance riding through bikepacking with a local organization, Out Our Front Door. I was learning that I really loved the sense of accomplishment that came from riding long distances.

So the sport interested me, but I also realize the other major aspect of randonneuring that was emphasized in those episodes was the camaraderie. I was slow to start with randonneuring (I only did one 200k my first year) but with the new Chicago Randonneurs region in 2024, I've really felt that sense of community. There's always an enthusiastic group to ride with, ready to give motivation and advice. "Joy shared is doubled and sorrow shared is halved"; I'm sure we can all think of a ride or two that applies to! I'm looking forward to longer attempts and shorter times with my club!"

#### ROULEUR

The Rouleur award is a domestic award earned by completing at least one event within each type and distance in the same calendar year:

- a 100-124 km populaire
- a 125-149 km populaire
- a 150-199 km populaire
- a 200-220 km brevet
- an 8-hour Dart populaire team randonnée of 120 km or longer. At least three team members must finish the ride together for this event to count for the award.

Each ride must be an event on the Randonneurs USA calendar.

Permanents and foreign events cannot be used to earn this award.

The award can only be earned once per calendar year.

Longer events cannot be substituted for shorter events (e. g., a 130 km populaire cannot be used for the 100-124 km counting event requirement; a 13.5-hour Dart team randonnée cannot be used for the 8-hour Dart team populaire.)
