The Board of Directors is pleased to announce that the 2025 American Randonneur Award was awarded to Rob Hawks (#2515).

Rob has been a dedicated member of Randonneurs USA since 2004, supporting the organization through numerous leadership roles both on and off the Board of Directors. His service includes terms as President (2016) and Vice-President (2013–2015). Since 2007, he has served as the Regional Brevet Administrator (RBA) for the San Francisco Randonneurs and recently concluded a four-year term as the RBA Liaison (2021–2024). Additionally, Rob has chaired the Brevet Committee, served on the Membership and inaugural Gravel Committees, and has represented Randonneurs USA at the annual Audax Club Parisien (ACP) meetings in France.



In August, Joe Ray (#10408) started his Port-to-Port American Randonneur quest with his wife, Michelle (#13998). After decades of work, his first official order of business in retirement was to trade the office chair for the saddle and the daily grind for the road on an eight week adventure.

His audacious goal was a coast-to-coast ride connecting 35 brand-new, linked RUSA permanents from Seaside,
